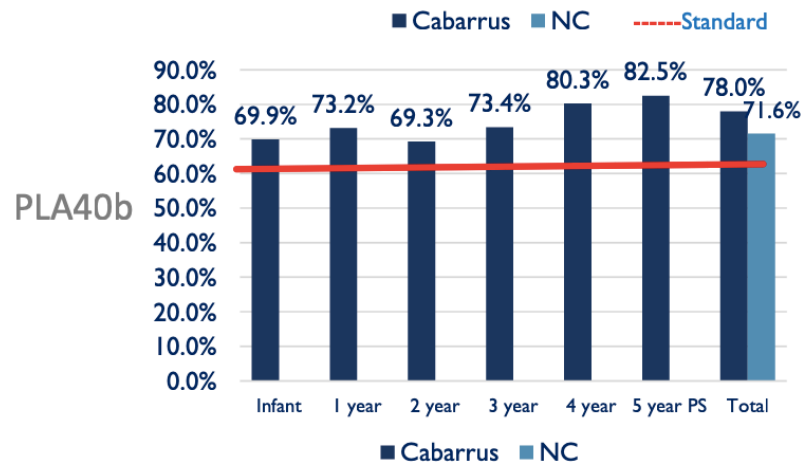
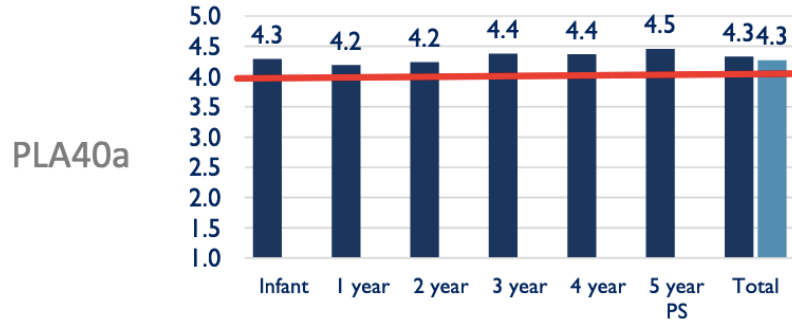


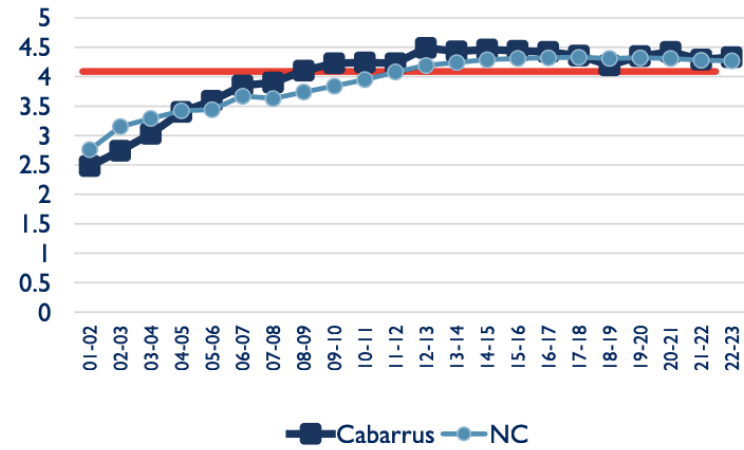

By Age FY22-23

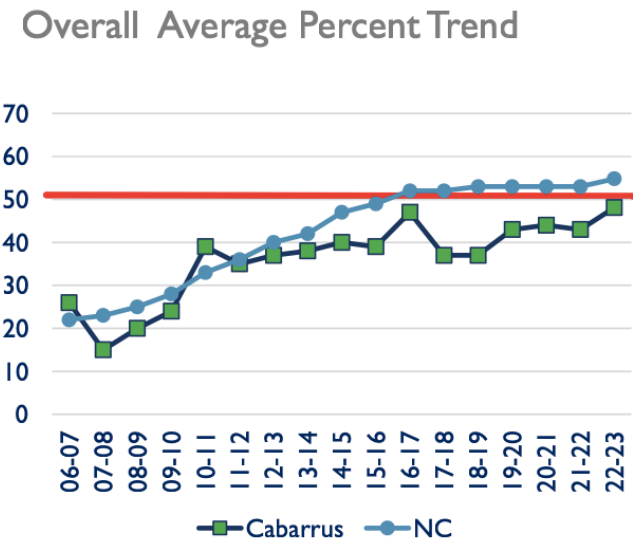
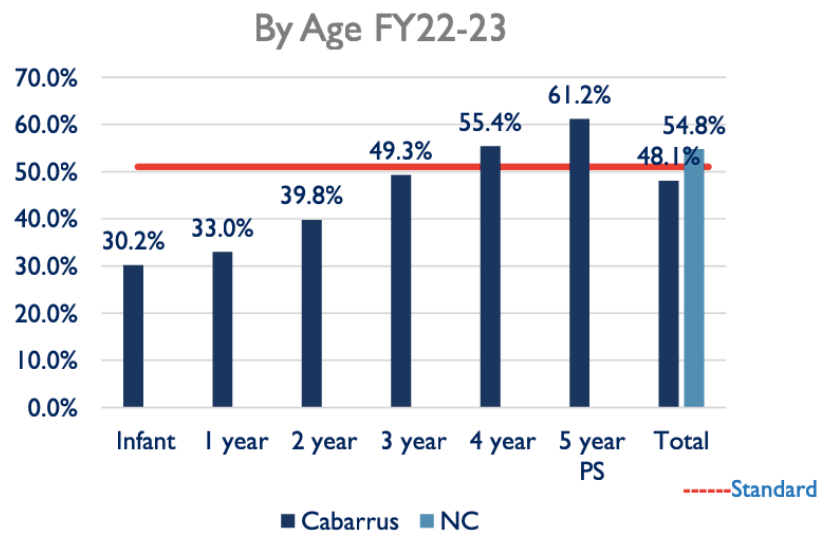


Overall Average Star Rating Trend

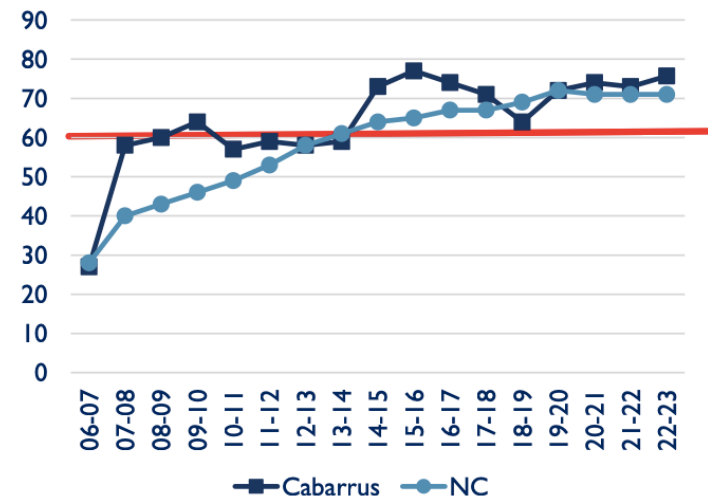

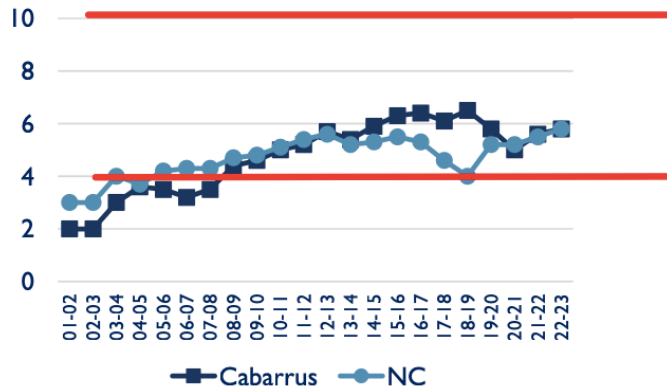

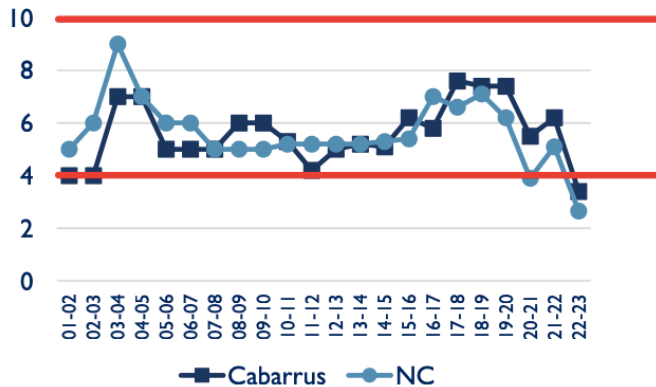
