<u>FY18-19 SS Expenditure Report</u>: Everyone is on target to meet their numbers except for Parents As Teachers, but they will be reverting the funding back to the Partnership. Project Baby Reach was having email trouble so they have no FSR in April, but will have two in May. Smart Start Subsidy – TANF will have two payments in June.

<u>FY18-19 Other Funds Expenditure Report</u>: all on track, we've received a few new donations for the June 8th School's Out Bash, as well as the new WHALE Program.

<u>FY18-19 NCPK Expenditure Report</u>: all on track, the final FSR is due by June 5th. Money left over in Direct Services will be taken back by the state this year instead of allowing us to move it to administration.

FY18-19 NC PK CCDF Expenditure Report: on track.

Program Oversight Committee:

Lauren Westin reported the Program Oversight Committee met on May 7, 2019, to discuss the FY 19-21 programs that were approved for the Smart Start Annual Plan. The Committee reviewed a request to put out and RFA for a Teacher Liaison Program to align the Partnership's strategic planning priority of improving teacher education with the services that we are providing.

The Committee recommended a CAD changed for Incredible Years to add wording to the CAD regarding the required Level 11 Certification. The Board voted and approved the CAD change unanimously.

The Committee also reviewed and recommended a change to the special populations that the Partnership will serve under Dual Subsidy. It is recommended that the Partnerships serve these special populations:

Teen Parents

- Three remaining three-year-olds at the Billingual Preschool that have no turned four years and do not qualify for NC Pre-K for one more year.
- Families that don't quite qualify under DHS regulations or families in crisis, the partnership can assist families in paying for childcare or co-pays in order to move them to success.

With Karen Calhoun and Steve Morris abstaining the Board unanimously approved these special populations to serve under Dual Subsidy.

School's Out Bash - June 8th from 10 a.m. - 2 p.m.:

Ann Benfield presented that the School's Out Bash is fast approaching. We are seeking donations or items for the emergency fund. If you are able to volunteer at the event, we would love to have you. The event will also serve as the roll-out of the WHALE Program in Cabarrus County, which places identifying emergency information on car seats in case of emergency.

Other Business:

Ann Benfield presented that the Grantee for Headstart in Cabarrus County backed out and there is currently no grantee for FY 19-20. Last week, Ann met with the Director of Headstart, Dr. Deborah Bergeron in Wasington, D.C., and discussed the issues that Cabarrus County has experienced over the last two years and years prior to that. Dr. Bergeron promised that she is coming to Concord to meet with the parents who have lived through this experience and she would really like as many county leaders as possible present. They have chosen a new grantee which will be announced on or around June 1st.

Head Wind/Tail Wind:

Robbie and Ann attended the NCPC Leadership Symposium earlier this month. Ann asked each board member to write down what they thought the Head Wind and Tail Winds the Partnership experiences with fund raining and fund development and other goals on the new newly adopted Strategic Plan. These ideas will be discussed at the next Board Meeting in June.
